How does the Lower Nemahbin Lake Association (LNLA) care for the lake?

- **Monitoring:** We monitor lake clarity, phosphorus and chlorophyll levels, reporting findings to the state.
- **Clean Boats Clean Waters:** This program conducts trailer inspections and educates boaters launching into the Nemahbins to ensure invasive plant and animal species do not overtake our lake.
- **Removal of Invasive Plants:** We have hired divers to remove invasive plants from Lower Nemahbin. Association volunteers have assisted in this work. Approved treatments have been administered to the worst patches of Eurasian Watermilfoil to limit its spread.
- **Dealing with Invasive Species:** We monitor and remove other invasive species, such as starry stonewort near the public launch site.
- **Coordination with Summit:** We provide input to the Village of Summit on matters that could affect the lake.
